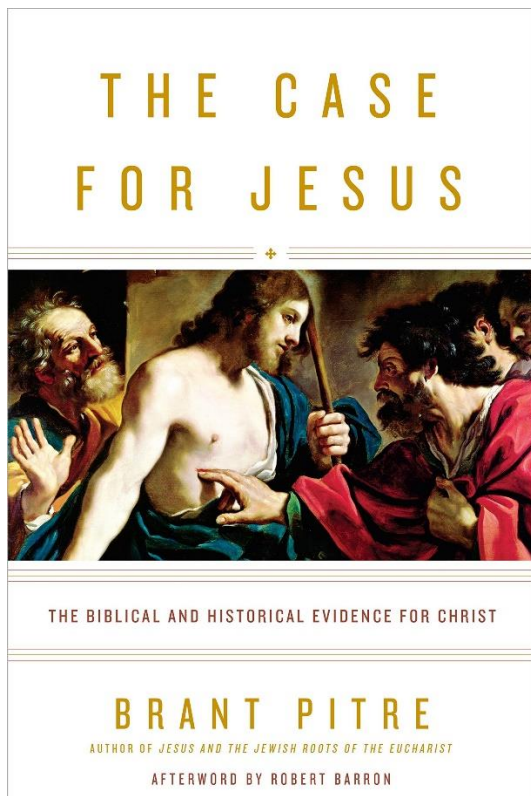

Pitre destroys Ehrman's analogy while presenting strong arguments as to why we can believe in the Jesus of the gospels.
